Kristi Jauregi Ondarra - TILA Project coordinator



Kristi Jauregi is Professor of Language Education at Fontys University of Applied Sciences and Lecturer-researcher at Utrecht University (The Netherlands). Her main area of research is on CALL, particularly on telecollaboration carried out with synchronous applications (video communication or 3D virtual worlds). She has been engaged in different projects funded by the European Commission (NIFLAR, Euroversity) and is project leader of TILA.

Sabela Melchor Couto - Tasks and platforms, an overview



Sabela Melchor-Couto is Senior Lecturer in Spanish at the University of Roehampton (London). Sabela's research activity focuses on the use of virtual worlds and videoconferencing software for language learning and teaching and its impact on affective variables, particularly anxiety. She is responsible for the English cluster in TILA and coordinates Work Package 1: Teacher Training Activities.

Petra Hoffstaedter - Focus on spoken communication through intercultural telecollaboration



Petra Hoffstaedter (Dr. phil.) is co-director of the Steinbeis Transfer Center Language Learning Media. In a number of EU projects, she has created and pedagogically implemented web-based language learning resources for various European languages. Her current research focus is on the use of telecollaboration for intercultural language learning and interpreter training. Together with Kurt Kohn, she is responsible for the German cluster in TILA and the work packages Research and Dissemination.

Kurt Kohn - Focus on spoken communication through intercultural telecollaboration



Kurt Kohn is professor emeritus of Applied English Linguistics at the University of Tübingen and co-director of the Steinbeis Transfer Center Language Learning Media. His research interests include English as a lingua franca and Lingua Franca pedagogy as well as telecollaboration applied to intercultural language learning and interpreter training. Together with Petra Hoffstaedter, he is responsible for the German cluster in TILA and the work packages Research and Dissemination.

Begoña Clavel - TILA experiences in telecollaboration between schools in Nijmegen and Meliana



Begoña Clavel-Arroitia is a lecturer in English Studies at the *Universitat de València* where she teaches Second Language Acquisition and Teaching English as a Foreign Language modules at both undergraduate and postgraduate level. She is a member of IULMA-UV (Interuniversity Institute of Applied Modern Languages, *Universitat de València*) and carries out research in the field of corpus linguistics and its applications to teaching, the implementation of ICT resources in language teaching, and the study of gender and language. She is a member of the research groups Gentext and CASTLE. She is responsible for the Spanish cluster in TILA.
